

PRIDE IN PACIFIC HEIGHTS YARD CONTEST

What is the Pride In Pacific Heights Yard Contest?

This is a friendly contest designed to have families of the community enter their yards for judging.

What will you be judged on?

Your yard will be judged on lawn care, weeds, flower beds, fence (front/back), house numbers visible front and back, back lane clean and general overall yard cleanliness/appearance.

Do I need to spend money on landscaping?

No, you are not required to spend money on landscaping as the judging will be based upon the above mentioned criteria and not on how many flowers or items you have in your yard. If you want to do landscaping, build a pond, etc. go ahead.

Is there a cost to enter?

There no cost to enter

Do I need to make a big flower garden?

This is not a requirement in the contest, but if you want to do so, go ahead.

Who can enter?

Anyone who lives in the Pacific Heights Community can enter. This is perfect opportunity to get your whole family involved. Why not even get your neighbor involved with a friendly challenge!

Who is judging?

There are 2 judges from a local greenhouse and one judge from the PHCA

Who do I contact to enter?

When does the contest start and end?

All entries must be in by July 15th and the judging will take place the last week of July and the first week of August. The judges will appear at random.

Are there going to be prizes?





Community Arts Program, Extension Division
