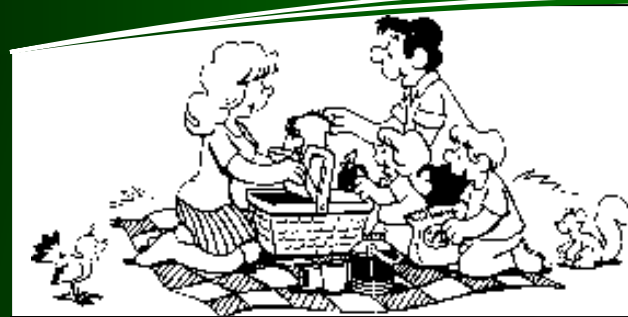

**Ward 3 and City News**

We are in the midst of spring, and that means clean-up mode. Recently, the City began cleaning our streets. If your street was missed, please let me know, as there will be some finishing-up work that will take place upon conclusion of the street cleaning schedule. I have received many questions about filling potholes and repaving streets. I am pleased to let you know that the intersection of Diefenbaker and Laurier Drive as well as Confederation Drive from Laurier Drive to Borden Place will be repaved this spring. The City crews hope to be able to start in early May. We are first on the list for paving this year.

I was recently asked about the possibility of having a walking lane around the perimeter of Pacific Park. I have just received a response to my enquiry, and have found out the cost would be approximately \$44,000. As this would be a capital project, it has been deferred to the 2013 budget deliberations, but I believe this would be beneficial to those who utilize the park, and will be supporting this project.

The Kensington Concept Plan was approved by City Council last month. Residents of Pacific Heights have been divided as to whether or not this plan will be beneficial to Pacific Heights. With the proposed traffic calming measures for Centennial and Diefenbaker Drive, I hope that it will become an extension of the wonderful community that is Pacific Heights. I am still working on whether or not Monck Avenue should be closed, and will be visiting residents in that area in the coming months in order to receive input from those most directly impacted by any changes.

Also approved by City Council last month was the awarding of the City-wide curb side recycling program to Loraas Disposals. While I was not a member of City Council at the time the debate took place regarding a mandatory curb side recycling program, I have certainly heard from many of you that you are concerned about this program. Since this program has been approved, it is my hope that it will become a service that residents will utilize.

Spring is on the horizon and we have had a mild winter, so it might seem odd to be discussing snow removal. However, I recently submitted an enquiry to the Administration to find out what the cost would be of implementing a residential snow program for 2013. I submitted the enquiry because many residents in Ward 3 have complained about the road conditions on residential streets during normal winter weather conditions. We have now received a report, which indicates a small increase to the mill rate would be required, and we will be debating it during the next budget cycle (December, 2012).

The balanced budget our government announced earlier this spring does several things. Not only does it keep our economy strong and growing, it also allows us to make investments that impact people in very real and significant ways.

Because of this budget, health regions will be able to perform 8,000 more surgeries this year. The cancer centres in Saskatoon and Regina will be able to perform 30,000 cancer drug treatments, 39,000 mammograms and 6,000 new patient appointments. Seniors eligible for benefits under the Seniors Income Plan (SIP) will see those benefits increase. As many as 7,000 more people with significant and enduring disabilities will become eligible for the Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disabilities (SAID) program.



Last November, you placed your trust in me to represent you in the Saskatchewan Legislature. I pledge to you that I will work hard every day to earn that trust. If I can be of assistance or if you would like to share any of your thoughts as to how we can make Pacific Heights an even better community, please don't hesitate to contact me.
