

The Blairmore Centre involves the development of a multi-district park in the Blairmore suburban development area. This site also includes the Tommy Douglas Collegiate, Bethlehem Catholic High School and a Civic Centre.

TIMELINES FOR DEVELOPMENT

Spring 2006 - 2007 Construction of the new high schools and Phase One of the Civic

Recreation Centre

Spring through summer 2007 Wrap up site servicing/roadwork and construct new intersection(s)

on 22nd Street to serve the suburban centre.

Spring 2007 - 2008 Construction scheduled to begin for Phase Two (aquatic)

September 2007 High schools open

Winter 2008 Civic Recreation Centre phase One opens

Fall 2008 Phase Two (Aquatic) Civic Recreation Centre scheduled to open




